International Week in ASE

May 9-13, 2022

The International Week in ASE is one of our university's signature events, designed to inspire discussions, foster debates, and share solutions related to the internationalization process which gained significant importance over the latest years. In the context, the International Week in ASE plays an important role in enhancing the internationalization dimension of our university by developing partnerships with the business environment, fostering sustainable cooperation with foreign universities, and creating new strategic alliances within university networks and consortiums. ASE strengthens its role as a promoter of innovation and dynamic integration into the competitive European academic environment, trying to constantly improve and adapt to the trends in education and research, having an increased international presence and a strong reputation at international level. All these factors contribute to the consolidation of ASE as an international brand, renowned for its role in the advancement of high-quality education and research, as well as in the development of a competitive and sustainable economy.

The 7th Edition of the International Week in ASE was organized in the university campus and online, and comprised 36 events (conferences, guest lectures, workshops, public presentations, debates) which gathered hundreds of participants (professors, students, university staff, officials, NGOs representatives, civil society). The series of events began on May 9th, on Europe Day, a day to celebrate peace and unity throughout Europe. On this occasion, the Vice-Rector of International Relations, Professor Marius Profiroiu, opened the International Week with some introductory remarks related to the challenges the EU is facing in these turbulent times, the impact on the higher education system, and some measures to successfully overcome them.

The International Relations Office, through the Erasmus+ divison, organized a series of conferences, lectures, seminars, webinars and debates, with the aim to popularize and raise awareness among students and academics on the key actions of the Erasmus+ Office, and the opportunities for research, learning, teaching, or training that are being offered through this program.



International Cooperation & Events

May 3 – The Vice-Rector of International Relations, Prof. Marius Profiroiu, received a delegation from The Academy of Economic Studies of Moldova (ASEM), comprising professors who participated in a one-month specialization program at our university.

May 4-6 – participation at the UNICA IRO meeting in Brussels. Representatives of International Relations Offices from more than 30 member universities engaged in debates, workshops, and study cases to discuss common challenges associated to transformations in European Higher Education, and share good practices and solutions to overcome them. Higher education in Europe has undergone remarkable transformations in the last years. From a **new Erasmus+ programme** that offers more mobility and cooperation opportunities than ever, to the **shared global challenges** such as the pandemic and the climate crisis, international relations officers from UNICA member universities are entering an era with new priorities, practices, and opportunities.



May 10 – The Vice-Rector of International Relations, Professor Marius Profiroiu had a meeting with Mr. Chris Frean, Head of Economic Diplomacy at the British Embassy in Bucharest. There was reiterated the openness for cooperation in order to initiate and develop new partnerships with British Universities, as well as the reciprocal interest in providing internships to our students within British companies located in Romania.

• May 16-17 – participation at the **Times Higher Education Europe Universities Summit** in Barcelona, Spain, where our university was represented by the **Rector**, **Professor Nicolae Istudor**, the **Vice-Rector of International Relations**, **Professor Marius Profiroiu**, and **Lecturer Oana Popovici**, representative of the International Relations Office. This year's theme was "Alliances for the future: Bridging education across Europe". At the junction of education, research and innovation, higher education has a unique position in shaping sustainable and resilient economies, and in making the EU greener, digitally literate and more inclusive. This summit addressed the benefits of alliances on resilience and progression, and how collaboration and knowledge-sharing through alliances would impact European and global cooperation.

May 18– On the occasion of the Times Higher Education Europe Universities Summit in Barcelona, our Rector, Professor Nicolae Istudor and our Vice-Rector of International Relations, Professor Marius Profiroiu, had a successful meeting with Dr. Josep M. Garrel Guiu, Rector, and Dr. Carlo Maria Gallucci Calabresse, Vice-Rector of International Relations at Ramon Llull University in Barcelona. Following the discussions, a Memorandum of Understanding and an Erasmus Inter-institutional Agreement are set to be signed by the two institutions, and a mutual support for joining academic and research international networks was established.

May 18 – 6 ASE students participated in a Blended Intensive Programme on Community Supported Agriculture, at Van Hall Larenstein, University of Applied Sciences in Velp, The Netherlands, as part of the Blended Seminar: Social Innovation and Entrepreneurship Spring 2022. The project focused on doing research and finding development solutions to the challenges faced by local farmerc, using as a case study the @hofbredelaar, a CSA enterprise which aims to encourage people to harvest their own plants in order to live a healthier life and reduce food waste.

May 26 – Professor Marius Profiroiu, Vice-Rector of International Relations, addressed the welcoming remarks at the Joint Conference Euro Working Group for Commodities and Financial Modelling and XIX International Conference on Finance and Banking (FIBA) 2022, online conference organized by the Faculty of Finance and Banking (ASE), EWG for Commodities and Financial Modelling, and Poznan University of Economic s and Business (PUEB).

AACSB INTERNATIONAL ACCREDITATION

• May 6 – In line with the series of events dedicated to the strategic objective of attaining AACSB business accreditation, the International Relations Department organized, at the initiative of the **Vice-Rector of International Relations**, **Professor Marius Profiroiu**, another **workshop** with the management and staff in charge with international accreditation, in order to continuously provide the necessary training, support, and guidance for a thorough understanding of the accreditation process, the application of its standards, and to set the upcoming steps the schools need to take for implementing the established measures and to track their progress. The devising of sustainable strategies for each faculty is a major challenge of our AACSB international accreditation process, therefore the workshop focused on the best ways to elaborate and implement these strategies in compliance with the AACSB standards.

• May 9-13 – representatives of the Erasmus+ Office participated at the **2022 Study Abroad Fair** at Koç University, Istanbul. Throughout the week, participants from different universities analyzed ways to create a welcoming climate for both students and academic staff from different backgrounds, in a thoughtful cross-cultural experience. At the same time, students were invited to explore *study abroad programs* and receive more details from university representatives.

۲ May 16-18 - The Erasmus+ Office organized, at Predeal, the 1st Edition of the workshop "Erasmus Without Papers: Digitalization of Mobility Programs", where representatives of ANPCDEFP and Erasmus+ Offices from Romanian universities participated (Babes-Bolyai University of Cluj, University of Bucharest, West University of Timisoara, University of Craiova, Polytechnic University of Bucharest and Ovidius University of Constanța). The digitalization of the Erasmus+ Office in ASE implies the launch of the digitalization process to ensure a unitary digital management framework for study, teaching and placement in line with the new Erasmus+ program 2021-2027, the need to integrate the university into the existing IT networks at national and European level which will ensure an increased visibility among the universities that run Erasmus mobility programs, and the acquisition of software services on the Mobility Online platform of the SOP company from Austria.

May 24 – The Erasmus+ team welcomed Mrs. Gülin Karahüseyinoğlu, International Exchange and Cooperation Senior Specialist at Sabanci University in Turkey, who joined our Erasmus+ Office in a training session for a week.

In April, ASE recorded the following **outgoing missions**:


