## ***International Cooperation and Agreements***

In August, our university concluded, through the International Relations Office, the following **agreements**:

1. Cooperation Agreement with **École Nationale D'Administration de Tunis (ENA)**;
2. Cooperation Agreement with **University of Commerce and Services in Poznan, Poland**.

*The cooperation framework approaches the exchange of teaching staff, academic materials and data sets, as appropriate, between the two parties; aims at promoting seminars, courses, conferences, lectures, at carrying out joint research projects and discussing experiences in areas of mutual interest; conducting student mobility activities during study and research; conducting joint scientific research, teaching and training projects; the promotion of cooperation in the field of doctoral studies; conducting cooperation seminars, workshops and other academic activities; the promotion of any other form of cooperation of mutual interest.*

## ***Working visits and international conferences***

### **Outgoing missions:**

- **1 working visit in The Netherlands** (August 16-17) - the **Vice-Rector of International Relations, Professor Marius Profiroi**, undertook a working visit at **Erasmus University Of Rotterdam**.
- **2 training mission in Greece** (August 28 - September 4) – **Professor Aceleanu Mirela** and **Professor Șerban Andreea Claudia** from The Faculty of Theoretical and Applied Economics were invited at the **University of West Attica**, within the Erasmus+ Staff Mobility for Training Program.

### **Incoming missions:**

- **1 training assignments: Mr. Stoyan Gigov** from the **University of National and World Economy, Sofia, Bulgaria**. Mr. Gigov undertook a one week staff training at our Erasmus+ Office, with the purpose of exchanging knowledge related to the Erasmus+ project management, overview of the project's flexibility and its financial efficiency.
- **In July, the International Relations Office facilitated the participation at 8 International Conferences and 1 research internship for BUES academics.**

**198 Students selected for Erasmus+ mobility in the 1<sup>st</sup> semester of the 2022-2023 academic year**

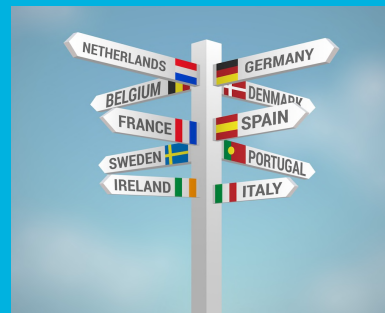

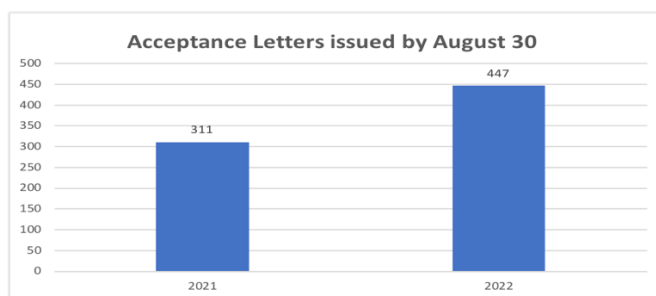


## Completion of the new Erasmus+ regulation proposal

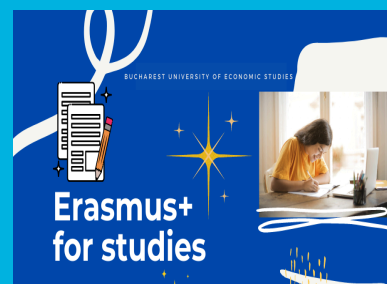
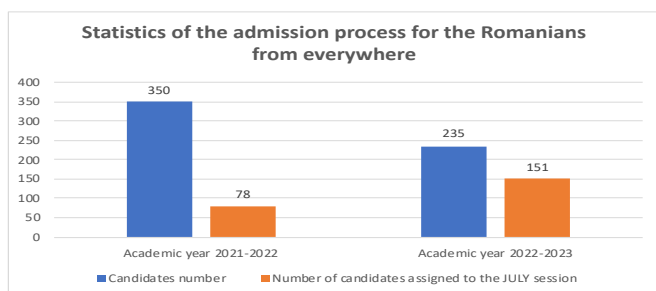
Within the new Erasmus+ Program 2021-2027, the recommendations of the National Agency for Community Programmes in the Field of Education and Vocational Training (ANPCDEFP-Romania) also concern the flexibility of the internal regulations of universities, in order to increase the number of students participating in the Erasmus+ program. Our Erasmus+ Office team, from the International Relations Department, proposed, among other things, **two selection sessions** for students who want to participate in mobilities, as stated in the new version of the "Regulation on student mobilities within the Erasmus program and other assimilated programs". This change resulted in the June 2022 selection, which increased the number of our Erasmus+ selected students from the first session (around 300 students) with approximately 40. The second change of the regulation was completed during the month of August and will be brought to the Senate in September. This new change will target **the selection criteria**, in particular the previous restrictive criterion of no failed exams and the minimum number of credits a student should have in order to apply for an Erasmus grant.

### International students at BUES

The admission process for foreign candidates from non-EU countries continued this month. Until **August 30<sup>th</sup>**, 584 files were sent in total and **447 letters of acceptance were issued by the Ministry** (as compared to 311 last year).



As for **Romanians from everywhere**, the figures remained the same as last month (the admission session), respectively 235 files sent and **151 candidates admitted** at our university.
