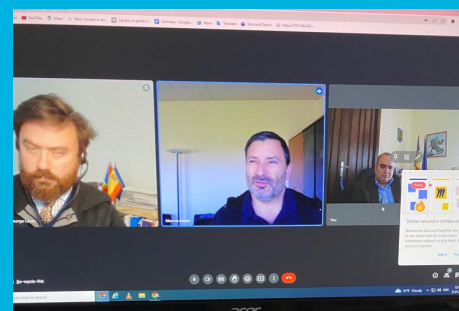
● CNAM Paris

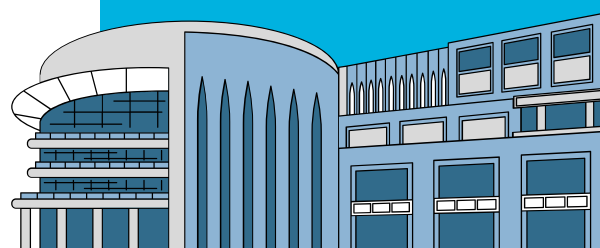

New year, new Erasmus rules

Starting with 2023, the internal regulations regarding the Erasmus for studies selection has changed in order to fulfill a more inclusive role. If last year, our students were only accepted for a mobility if they had obtained 100% of their ECTS, **this year, our Bachelor and Master students can apply with a minimum of 70% ECTS at the end of the winter exam session.** However, the Doctoral students are still required to have 100% ECTS to qualify for a mobility.

- Bachelor:
 - 1st year: 21 ECTS
 - 2nd year: 63 ECTS
 - 3rd year: 105 ECTS
 - 3rd supplementary year: 126 ECTS
- Master:
 - 1st year: 21 ECTS after the 1st semester
 - 2nd year: 63 ECTS after the 1st-3rd semesters
 - 2nd supplementary year: 84 ECTS

The new Erasmus Programme

● The Erasmus grants for students were increased, according to the latest worldwide economical standpoint

For studies

- EU partner countries from Regions 1-4 and 6-13*: **700 euro/month**;
- Group 1+2 of EU Member States and third countries associated to the Programme: **600 euro/month**;
- Group 3 of EU Member States and third countries associated to the Programme: **540 euro/month**.

For placements (internships, traineeships etc):

- EU partner countries from Regions 1-4 and 6-13*: **700 euro/month**;
- Group 1+2 of EU Member States and third countries associated to the Programme: **750 euro/month**;
- Group 3 of EU Member States and third countries associated to the Programme: **690 euro/month**.

! For countries not in the EU, but which are partners to the programme, from regions 1-4 and 6-13, the students will also receive **an additional transportation top-up**, according to the distance bandwidth.**

● Travelling "Green" is now encouraged

Students will benefit from a **50 euro top-up** if they prove that they will travel eco-friendly, with either one or multiple of the following: train, bus, boat, car-sharing. This type of top-up is only available for the **EU Member States and third countries** associated to the Programme from Regions 5 - 14.

For countries not in the EU, but which are partners to the programme, from regions 1-4 and 6-13, the green transportation top-up is done according to a distance bandwidth and can be consulted online, in the newest programme guide.

● The social top-up was also increased

Students with a background of reduced opportunities will benefit from a **250 euro monthly top-up**, according to criteria found online in the newest programme guide.

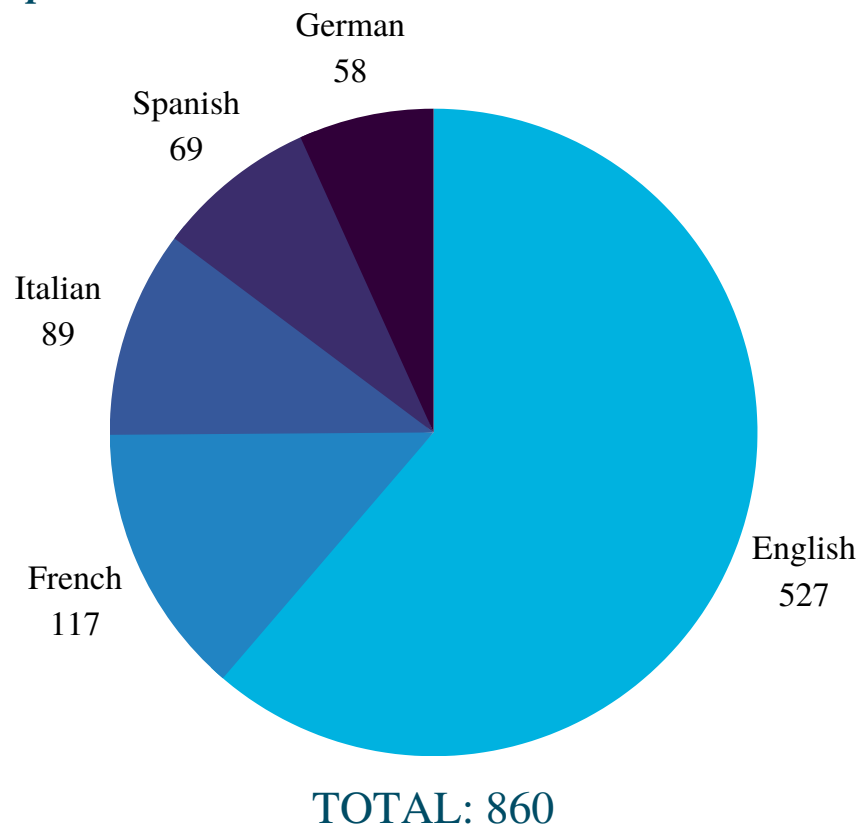
