International Week Events

8th of May 2023

• The Path ahead for the European construction. The role of universities in this process

The opening session of the 8th International Week at our university focused on two key themes: the latest trends in the European Union related to inclusivity, sustainability, and digitalization and the completion of the EU's Economic and Monetary Union and the challenges and prospects that this process entails. The session began with an overview held by Prof. Constantin Marius Profiroiu, Vice–Rector for International Relations, of the EU's efforts to promote inclusivity, sustainability, and digitalization, highlighting the progress made in recent years and the challenges that still need to be addressed in university matters.

• Completing Europe's Economic and Monetary Union: Challenges and Prospects

Following this, the session shifted its focus to the completion of the *EU's Economic and Monetary Union*. The speaker, Prof. Elena Dănescu, from the University of Luxembourg, presented the progress made in recent years toward greater economic integration within the EU, highlighting the benefits that a fully integrated economic and monetary union could bring. At the same time, she also identified the challenges that still need to be overcome, including issues related to debt sustainability, fiscal policy coordination, and banking union.

• Welcome meeting - 1st edition of the International Erasmus+ Staff Training Week in ASE

This week also marks the 1st edition of the International Erasmus+ Staff Training Week in ASE, coordinated by Ms. Teodora Fulga, PhD, Head of the Erasmus+ Office, who presented the Erasmus+ Programme in ASE to a total of 17 foreign guests from 10 partner universities, from countries such as Azerbaijan, Chile, France, Georgia, Greece, Morocco, Poland, Ukraine and Uzbekistan. During this week, the guests followed 4 workshops, 7 meetings, as well as other leisure and visiting events.



9th of May 2023

• British Transnational education partnership in Europe: The case study of Lancaster University

On the second day of the International Week, we started with Prof. Constantin Blome, Rector at Lancaster University in Leipzig, who described the University of Lancaster and all the branches it has: Sunway University from Malaysia was established in 2006 and has over 5500 students; Lancaster University College at Beijing Kiaotong University was established in 2016 with over 1500 students; Lancaster University from Ghana was established in 2012 with over 300 students; and the one from Leipzig was established in 2019 with over 220 students. Mr. Rector highlighted in the presentation the programs that the Leipzig branch makes available to students and included their opinions.

• ANPCDEFP workshop: E+ staff training week

Mrs. Nicoleta Popa from the National Erasmus Agency explained to us how important Erasmus is and how much you can develop with the help of this program. We also talked about the *European Year of Skills*. The initiative aims to raise awareness of the importance of skills and provide opportunities for individuals to acquire the skills they need to succeed in today's rapidly changing world. *The European Year of Skills* is part of the *European Skills Agenda* introduced in 2020, a comprehensive framework designed to increase the quality, relevance and effectiveness of skills development in Europe. It comprises twelve key actions that focus on areas such as digital skills, green skills and vocational education and training.

• ESN workshop: E+ staff training week

This event was held by Ms. Octavia Tudorache from the *Erasmus Student Network* who spoke about the international value of the advocacy for youth and the types of imputs that the young generation can be allowed to give in higher education institutions. The guests were then asked to brainstorm ways of increasing their students' implication in key decisionmaking of their home university.













10th of May 2023

• SDGs workshop: E+ staff training week

Prof. Elena Preda, Director of the *Research Center for Sustainable Development* organized a workshop on Connected and Engaged for a Sustainable Future - Sharing experience and tangible actions for mainstreaming SDGs in universities and increasing the societal impact. Prof. Preda highlighted that the SDGs are relevant to universities in several ways. Firstly, universities are institutions that produce knowledge and educate the next generation of leaders and professionals. As such, they have an important role to play in advancing the SDGs through research, teaching, and outreach. Universities can contribute to achieving the SDGs by conducting research that addresses pressing global challenges and developing innovative solutions to complex problems.

• Promoting mobilities workshop: E+ staff training week

Ms. Camelia Vlăsceanu from the Erasmus+ Office presented methods used in PR for promoting international mobilities for students. The emphasis of this workshop was on learning more about the target audience, as an aid to the process of elaborating an impactful design. The guests were asked to DIY their own poster in groups of three and compete for the best design and for the most efficient use of available tools.

11th of May 2023

• Erasmus+ info session for all ASE students

Ms. Maria Todircan from the *Erasmus+ Office* presented the open opportunities for ASE students regarding the EU financed international mobilities. The two main focuses of this presentation were:

- 1. *Erasmus for studies* mobilities which reffers to students experiencing a semester or a whole academic year abroad, at a partner university of ASE;
- 2. *Erasmus for placements* mobilities which reffer to students spending a whole summer vacation or a predetermined post-graduation period abroad, at an institution or company of their own choice, enrolled in an internship, traineeship or volunteering experience, also financed by the EU.













Moreover, this year is a landmark for the new *Blended Intensive Programs*, which consist of a few weeks of virtual courses on a subject, followed by a single week of abroad mobility, financed by the EU, consisting of intensive daily workshops related to the studied subject. The BIP initiative gives students the chance to equivalate the ECTS of a subject from their curriculum, similar to a modular course. The BIP mobilities are co-implemented with other partner universities and target specific hot topics.

• Erasmus+ destinations fair

Held on the 1st floor hallway of the Ion Angelescu building of ASE, the fair and exhibition hosted a number of 14 promotional stands and it was created especially for students, in order for them to meet and get familiarized with representatives of ASE's Erasmus+ partner universities, companies organizations. The exhibitors for the Erasmus+ for studies opportunities were: Azerbaijan Technical University, Dnipropetrovsk State University of Internal Affairs, East European University, Hassan II University, ENCG- Casablanca, Helena Chodkowska University of Technology and Economics, Hellenic Open University, IUT Aix-Marseille Université, Mohamed VI Polytechnic University, Tashkent Institute of Finance and Universidad Central de Chile. The exhibitors for the Erasmus+ for placements opportunities were: AIESEC, ESN and TOA (The Orange Academy Netherlands). The Erasmus+ Office from ASE also had its own informational stand.

• Cultural workshop for ASE's foreign students

This workshop was organized for the exchange and full-time foreign students of ASE with the aim of enriching the social connections, by describing arrays from their own culture within a guided communication environment. The students had to write down titles of books or movies made by artists from their own country and, in groups, to start writing an imaginary plot, which was afterwards presented in parallel with the real plot and actual meaning of the artpiece.

• Leisure, visiting and other activities for the guests

The guests of the staff week also attended a few of the faculty events, as well as other planned activities (guided tour & museum visits).

• Our Rector Prof. Nicolae ISTUDOR together with our Vice-rector for International Relations Prof. Constantin Marius PROFIROIU welcomed Prof. Jean-Michel EYMERI-DOUZANS, President of the *European Group for Public Administration* (EGPA). The network our university is part of, is the major learned society in the domain of administrative sciences on the European continent, and a regional group of the *International Institute of Administrative Sciences* (IIAS). EGPA aims at being the *European Platform for Public Administration* associating specialized researchers and practitioners.

17th of May



The Network of Institutes and Schools of Public Administration in Central and Eastern Europe (NISPAcee) was established in 1994 having set a goal to respond to the changing and increasing role of PA during the post-Soviet political. Between 2014 and 2016, the network was chaired by Prof. Constantin Marius Profiroiu.

• The delegation from the FABIZ faculty, represented by Prof. Mihail Busu and Prof. Stere Stamule visited *The Turkish-German University of Istanbul*, Faculty of Business Administration and *Özyeğin University*, Faculty of Business. My name is Iulian and I'm a master's student at the Faculty of Administration and Public Management. In April 2023, I participated in the Erasmus+ Blended Intensive Programme (BIP) 'Good Governance: A Pathway to Resilient Organizations', hosted by the Faculty of Economics and Business at the

University of Zagreb, Croatia.



It was definitely a very productive experience where I was able to develop both professionally and personally. From a personal point of view, I interacted with a lot of students from different cultures, especially since they came from three international universities: Bucharest University of Economic Studies (Romania), University of Zagreb (Croatia) and Complutense University of Madrid (Spain).

Even more interesting was that all the students from Spain came actually from Latin America, being natives from Chile, Colombia, Peru and Costa Rica. Basically, it was an explosion of multiculturalism, which impacted me a lot and made me very happy.

Regarding the main topic of the BIP, the theme was the relationship between corporate governance and organizational resilience. The discussions focused on good governance and sustainable development, governance at the corporate level and the role of the board in securing resilience, resilience in leadership and how to lead despite change and obstacles. The program also included a student workshop, a simulation game of good management practices, and three study visits to different organizations: the Croatian National Bank on the topic of management in regulators, the agricultural cooperative Hortico on the topic of management in cooperatives and the city of Sisak on the subject of local self-government management.

Finally, I would like to sincerely thank the entire project team that made this Erasmus+ experience possible and, in particular, the Faculty of Administration and Public Management, for giving me the opportunity to be an ambassador and take part in this great project!
