Marius Profiroiu, Prof. Constantin Vice-rector international relations welcomed to our University a group of 20 Japanese students accompanied by 3 professors from the University of Hyogo, ASE's partner institution. Between 04th and 06th of March, our guests will be exchanging experiences with ASE Bucharest's students as part of the Japanese university's Global Leader Education Program (GLEP). The Japanese delegation will also meet members of the ASE Centre for Japanese Studies, teachers and students of the Modern Applied Languages programme of the Faculty of International Business and Economics Facultatea de Relatii Economice Internationale and ASE students enrolled in the optional Japanese language course. The programme of the visit also includes joint academic and cultural activities, through which Japanese students will get to know both our university and everyday life in Bucharest.
