

- **Partnership for Reconstruction: Establishment of the Trilateral Chamber of Commerce Romania-Ukraine-Republic of Moldova (CCTRUM)"**

On January 20, Prof. Ioan Radu Petrariu, Dean of the Faculty of International Business and Economics at our University, participated in the High-Level Conference "Partnership for Reconstruction: Establishment of the Trilateral Chamber of Commerce Romania-Ukraine-Republic of Moldova (CCTRUM)", organized under the auspices of the Alliance of Eastern European MEPs for the Reconstruction of Ukraine (AMEERU) and the Institute for Development and Project Expertise – IDEP Moldova in Chisinau, Republic of Moldova. The event brought together decision-makers, public policy experts, and representatives of the institutional and economic environment from Romania, Ukraine, and the Republic of Moldova, with the aim of institutionalizing trilateral economic cooperation as an operational tool dedicated to the reconstruction of Ukraine and the strengthening of Eastern European regional cooperation.


The meeting aimed to finalize the institutional and governance framework for the establishment of the Romania-Ukraine-Republic of Moldova Trilateral Chamber of Commerce (CCTRUM) and to discuss the stages of its establishment, identifying joint economic cooperation and investment projects for the reconstruction of Ukraine, and developing joint recommendations for the authorities and business community in the three countries, aimed at supporting the post-conflict recovery process and regional integration.

INTERNATIONALIZATION ACTIVITIES CARRIED OUT BY THE FACULTIES WITHIN BUES

University internationalization is a key pillar of institutional development in contemporary higher education, reflecting universities' commitment to academic excellence, global competitiveness, and international cooperation. This process entails the integration of an international dimension into teaching, research, institutional governance, and academic services, through a variety of tools and policies: academic mobility, study programs in foreign languages, strategic partnerships, participation in international university alliances, and the pursuit of prestigious accreditations.

In this context, the Bucharest University of Economic Studies (BUES) plays an active role in promoting internationalization by diversifying its international academic offerings, increasing its visibility in global rankings, and participating in European initiatives such as the European University Alliances. The institution also aims to strengthen an open and intercultural organizational culture that supports the development of globally competitive graduates and fosters the production of internationally relevant knowledge.



Faculty of Marketing Committed to Expanding International Mobility and Experiences



The Faculty of Marketing reaffirms its commitment to contributing to the internationalization of the Bucharest University of Economic Studies. Together with colleagues from the International Relations Department, we have explored ways to increase both the number and quality of international mobility opportunities and experiences for students, master's students, doctoral candidates, and faculty members.

Key initiatives discussed include:

- Blended Intensive Programs (BIP): Modern “summer schools” that combine online interaction with short on-site mobility periods (5–7 days). This format is ideal for collaboration with at least three European universities and offers students recognized credits through modern teaching methods.
- Teaching mobility for faculty: We aim to build recurring bridges where our professors can collaborate directly with their international counterparts and gain insights into the expectations of students from other universities.
- Group mobility, internships, and practical training: Discussions focused on organizing groups of students (10–40 participants) for international internships, providing them with the framework to experience how marketing operates in leading organizations abroad.

Through these initiatives, the Faculty of Marketing strives to prepare graduates to become global citizens, familiar with innovation hubs in Europe and beyond, ready to face the challenges of a constantly evolving international market.

During the weekly Scientific Seminar “Money, Finance, Banking” organized by the Faculty of Finance and Banking, Radu CRISTEA delivered a presentation on “Above and Beyond Interest Rates: Risk-taking and Large Central Bank Balance Sheets”. His paper documents how the yield curve alone may not be a sufficient statistic to gauge how financial markets internalize monetary policy announcements. Analyzing the high-frequency reaction of riskier asset prices around central bank announcements in the US and UK, above and beyond yield curve surprises, the paper highlights the multi-faceted nature of the risk-taking channel of monetary policy. Risk-on channels associated with conventional monetary policy could be linked to the search for yield and low economic uncertainty, but during the era of unconventional monetary policy, strong evidence links an additional risk-taking channel to excess liquidity and portfolio rebalance. More broadly, these results suggest unconventional monetary policies have been more effective than previously estimated.

New Partnerships Formed




Üsküdar University TURKEY
