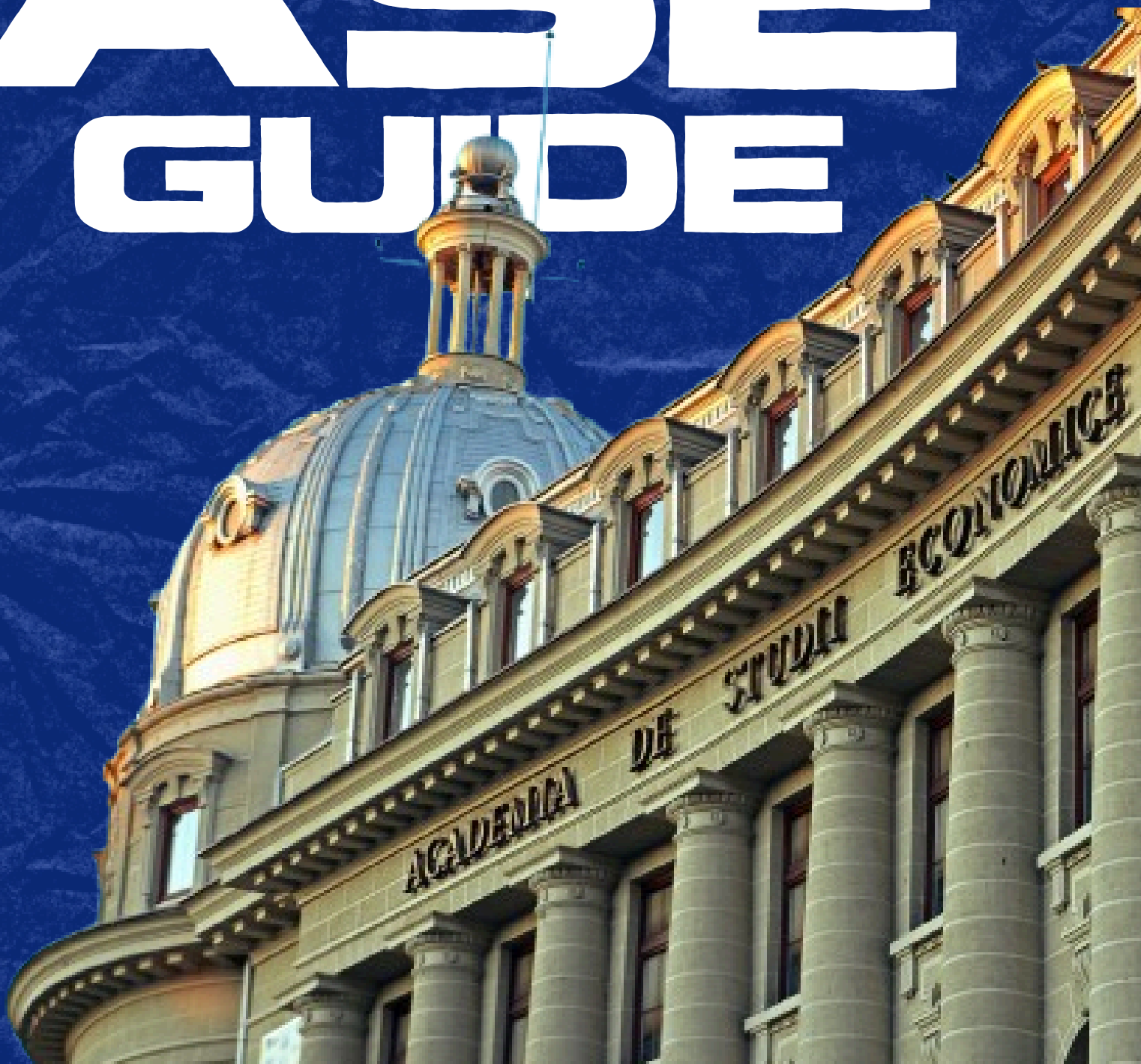

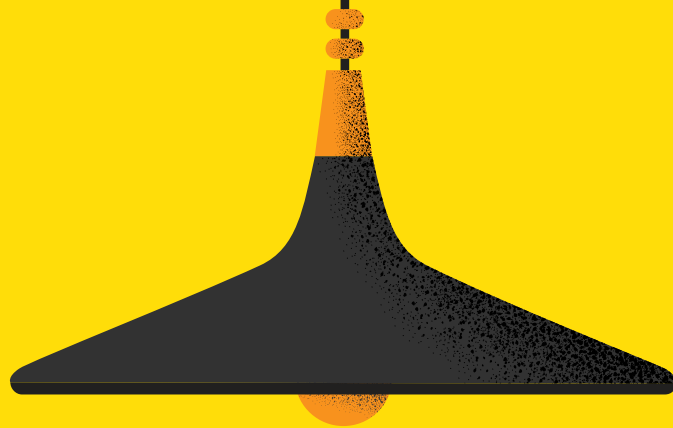

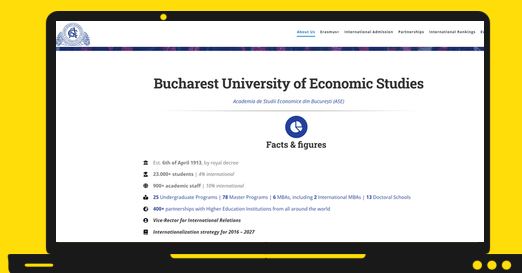

INTERNATIONAL RANKINGS

Year after year, **Bucharest University of Economic Studies (ASE)** strengthens its role as Romania's leading university in economics and public administration, driven by strong international recognition and academic excellence

Bucharest University of Economic Studies (ASE) ranks **1st nationally for the 7th consecutive year**, according to the **Times Higher Education World University Rankings 2026**, and is placed in the **801-1000 interval globally**, among **2,191 universities** from **115 countries**.

In the **Times Higher Education University Impact Rankings 2025**, ASE records a significant improvement, ranking **201-300 worldwide** with a total score of **80.1/100**, and **2nd nationally** among 25 Romanian universities. The ranking evaluates universities' contributions to the 17 UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). ASE achieved notable positions in:

- SDG 5 – Gender Equality: 31st out of 1,559 institutions
- SDG 1 – No Poverty: 90th out of 1,267 institutions
- SDG 8 – Decent Work and Economic Growth: 101-200
- SDG 17 – Partnerships for the Goals: 101-200

In the **Times Higher Education World University Rankings by Subject 2025**, ASE remains listed for the **7th consecutive year**, ranking: *Social Sciences*: **601-800**, *Business & Economics*: **801+**



QS World University Rankings by Subject 2025:

In the **QS World University Rankings by Subject 2025**, ASE records a positive upward trend, **ranking 351-400 in Economics & Econometrics** (up from 401-450 in the previous edition) and **501-550 in Business & Management** (up from 601-620).

The University maintains its national leadership in Economics & Econometrics.

The QS ranking assesses institutions based on academic reputation, employer reputation, research impact, and international collaboration networks.



Shanghai Global Ranking of Academic Subjects (GRAS) 2025:

In the **2025 edition of the Shanghai Global Ranking of Academic Subjects**, ASE ranks **1st in Romania** and in the **201-300 interval worldwide in Economics**, marking a significant improvement compared to the previous year (**301-400**).

The Shanghai Ranking is internationally recognized for its rigorous methodology, based exclusively on objective **research performance indicators** and **academic impact**, confirming the international visibility and competitiveness of economic research conducted at ASE.



ASE is also present for the **5th consecutive year in the World University Rankings for Innovation (WURI) 2025**, ranking **155th globally among the Top 400 Innovative Universities**.



In the **2025 Webometrics Ranking**, Bucharest University of Economic Studies **ranks 4th in Romania** among Romanian universities evaluated at the international level, **out of over 32,000 higher education institutions worldwide**, according to the latest edition of this global ranking.





LIBRARIES

Students have access to hundreds of databases of economic information, catalogues of web addresses specific to their economic fields – mirrored by references to other national and international libraries, universities and economic institutes, as well as virtual references.

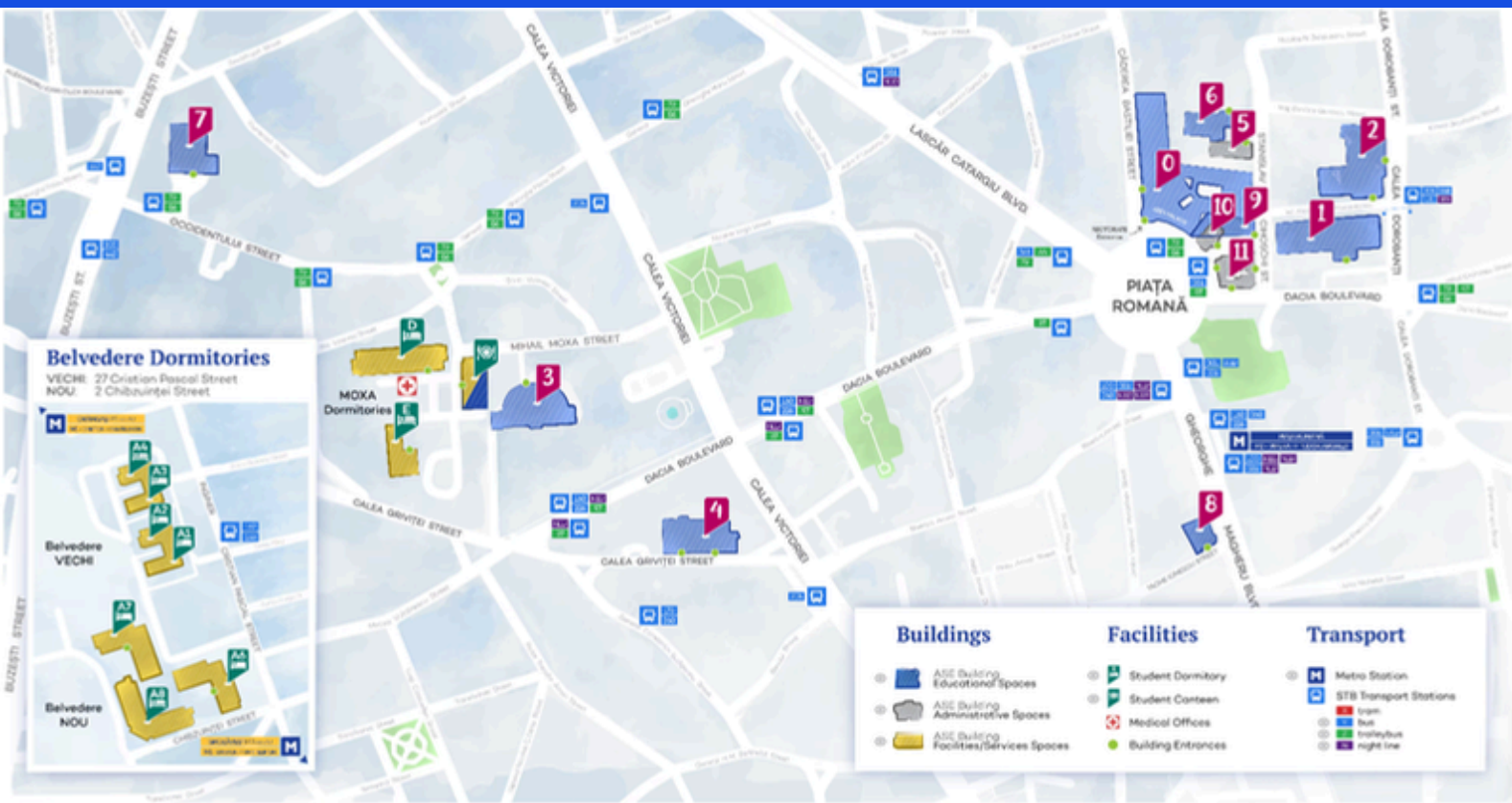

! Bucharest University of Economic Studies (ASE) has **12 buildings**, most of them located in **Piaţa Romană**. The rooms are coded as follows:

– for the first **9 buildings** (from **Building 0** to **Building 8**)

X – represents the building number
Y – represents the floor where the room is located
ZZ – represents the room number

Example: Room **0227** is located in **Building 0**, on the **2nd floor**, room number **27**

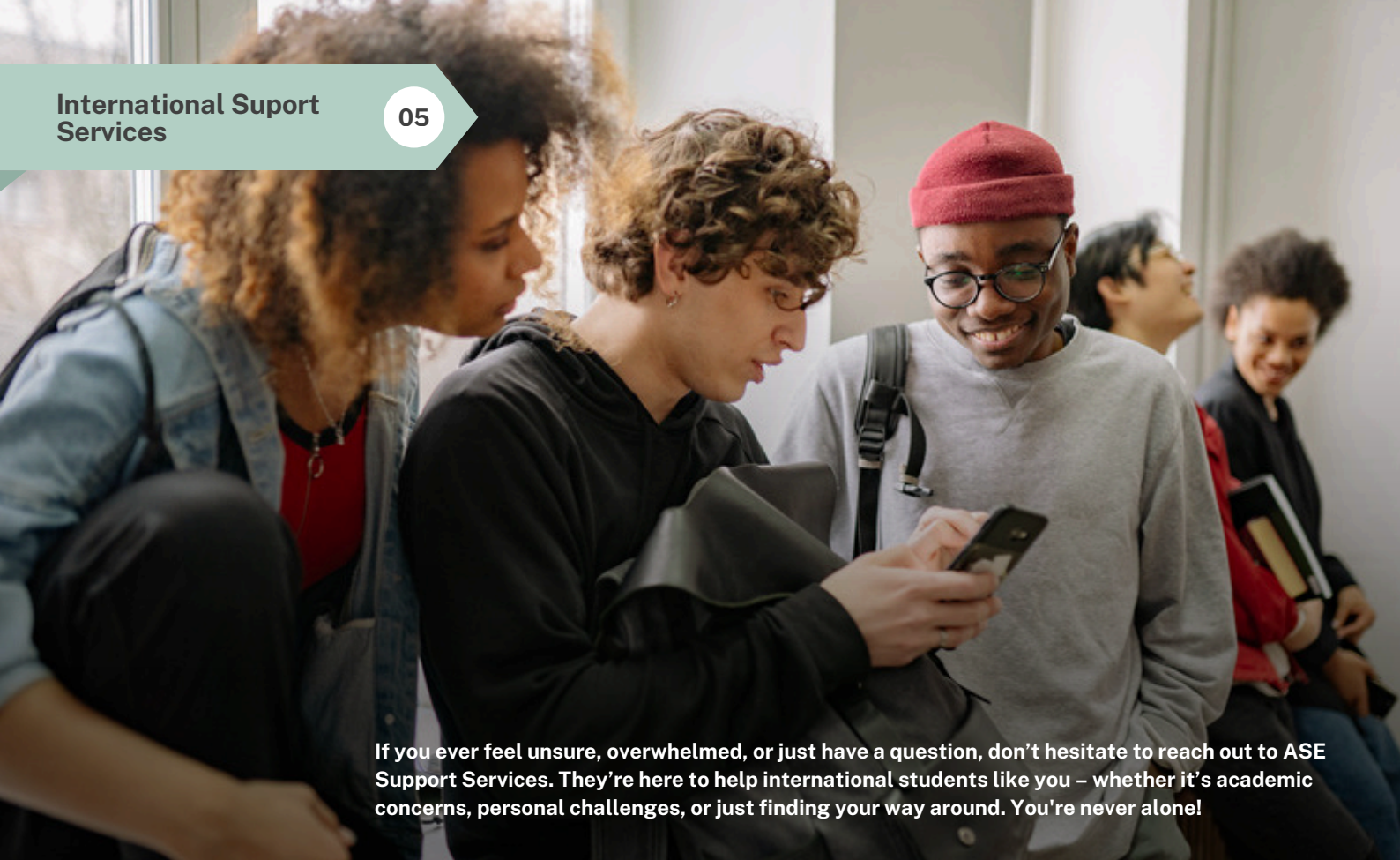

OBTAIN A LONG-STAY VISA/RESIDENCE PERMIT

For a VISA:

Step 1: Get Accepted by our University

Before applying for a visa, you must:

- Apply to our university (you will find all the information regarding the admission process on our website: <https://international.ase.ro/21/international-admission/>).
- Receive a Letter of Acceptance for Studies from the Romanian Ministry of Education.

Step 2: Apply for a Long-Stay Student Visa (Type D/SD)

Apply at the Romanian Embassy or Consulate in your home country (You will need to look on the website of the Romanian Foreign Affairs Ministry (MAE) <http://mae.ro/en/node/2035> for all the necessary information).

 **Visa processing time:** Around 60 days.

For a Residence Permit:

After entering Romania, you must apply for a residence permit **at the territorial units of the General Inspectorate for Immigration (IGI)** in the county where you reside (check their website for more information at igi.mai.gov.ro).

IMPORTANT:

- Submit your application at least 30 days before the expiration of your visa.
- Residence permits are typically valid for one year and must be renewed annually.
- Students holding a Romanian state scholarship are exempt from paying residence permit fees.

HEALTH INSURANCE AND HEALTHCARE

Getting a health insurance

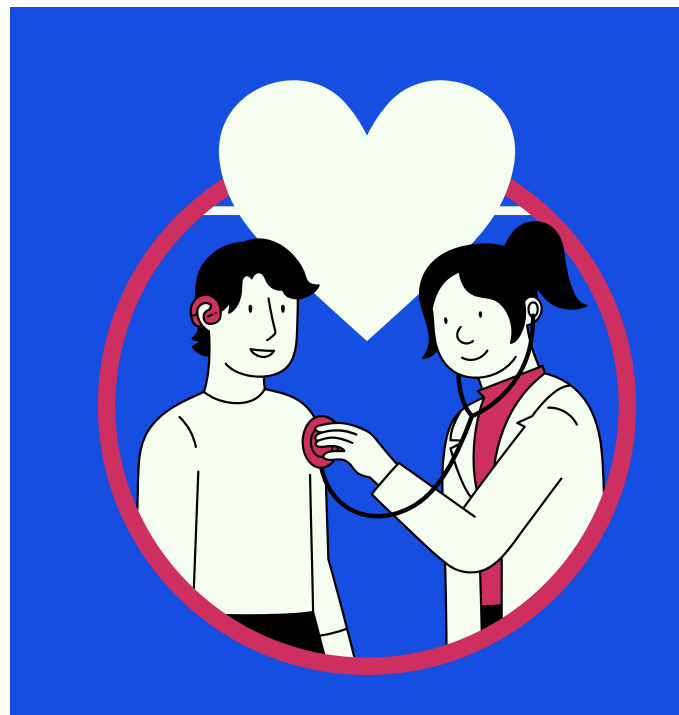
All international students are required to have a **medical insurance valid for the entire period of studies with our university** – either the European health card or a private insurance.

Medical examinations are free at our university's doctor's office. **The office is located in the Moxa campus.** You may find there general physicians (3 doctors and 5 nurses) and dentists (4 doctors and 3 nurses). The doctors are available from **Monday to Friday**, between **08:00** and **19:00**.

- **Specialist examinations** must be requested by your general physician and will be carried out in a specialised unit (outside the university).
- **EU students with EU health card or Health Certificate** can go directly to the general doctors they have chosen. Some consultation or investigations might be subject to special fees (partial or no payment from your insurance).

IMPORTANT:

In case of emergency situations, the number **112** is available nationwide, free of charge in any telecom network. All hospitals have an emergency room, available 24 hours a day. The service is generally free and open to everybody.



OPENING A BANK ACCOUNT

Top Banks for International Students in Romania



Banca Transilvania (BT)

- Student Package: Offers a zero-fee current account with a Visa Classic debit card, free BT Pay app, and zero interbank charges if you receive at least 60 €/month.
- Requirements:
 - Proof of student status (university certificate or stamped student card).
 - Valid passport (EU/EEA/Swiss citizens can use their national ID).
 - Taxpayer Identification Number (TIN) from your home country.
 - Proof of address (e.g., utility bill, bank statement, or residence certificate).
- Opening Process: Accounts must be opened in person at a BT branch.
- Fee: Varies depending on the account type and services chosen.



Banca Comercială Română (BCR)

- Student Accounts: Offers various student current accounts with options for debit cards and online banking.
- Requirements: Proof of student status, valid ID, and proof of address.
- Opening Process: Accounts can be opened online or at BCR branches.
- Fee: Varies depending on the account type and services chosen.



ING Bank

- Student Accounts: Provides student accounts with options for debit cards and online banking.
- Requirements: Proof of student status, valid ID, and proof of address.
- Opening Process: Accounts can be opened online or at ING branches.
- Fee: Varies depending on the account type and services chosen.

Common Documents Required

MOBILE PHONE SERVICES

Top Mobile Providers for International Students in Romania



Orange Romania

- **Prepaid SIM Cards:** Orange offers various prepaid SIM cards suitable for students. For instance, a 5 € SIM card comes with 6 € credit, including 300 minutes of voice calls, unlimited domestic texts, and 4 GB of data.
- **eSIM Availability:** Orange provides eSIMs for tourists, allowing for easy activation without the need for a physical SIM card.
- **Network Coverage:** Known for extensive coverage across Romania, ensuring reliable connectivity in both urban and rural areas.



Vodafone Romania

- **Prepaid SIM Cards:** Vodafone offers competitive prepaid plans. For example, the "Red 10" plan provides 10GB of data and 4G speed for 4 €/month.
- **eSIM Availability:** Currently, Vodafone does not offer eSIMs for tourists; only physical prepaid SIM cards are available.
- **Network Coverage:** Provides good network coverage in major cities and towns.



Telekom Romania

- **Prepaid SIM Cards:** Telekom offers the "Mobil 25" plan, which includes 25GB of data for 5€/month.
- **eSIM Availability:** Telekom does not offer eSIMs for tourists; only physical prepaid SIM cards are available.
- **Network Coverage:** Offers extensive coverage across Romania, ensuring reliable service.

✔ Tips for International Students

- **Phone Compatibility:** Ensure your phone is unlocked and compatible with Romanian networks.
- **eSIM vs. Physical SIM:** eSIMs offer convenience and flexibility, especially for short-term stays.
- **Data Usage:** Consider your data needs based on your usage habits. For instance, if you plan to stream videos or use data-intensive apps, opt for plans with higher data allowances.
- **Payment Methods:** Some providers may require a Romanian bank account or local payment methods. International eSIM providers like Airalo and aloSIM accept international credit/debit cards.
- **Customer Support:** Check if the provider offers English-speaking customer support for assistance.



TRANSPORTATION



Metrorex (Bucharest Metro) – Fast & Reliable

- ✓ Best For: Commuting to university, downtown, malls, or large stations
- Coverage: 5 metro lines (M1–M5) covering most of Bucharest, including university areas.
- Frequency: Every 5–10 minutes during peak hours
- Cost:
 - Single trip: 1 €
 - 10 trips: 8 €
 - Unlimited monthly pass: 20 €
 - 🎓 Student discount: 90% off with valid student ID → 2 €/month

STB (Surface Public Transport) – Affordable & Extensive

- ✓ Best For: Accessing parts of the city not served by the metro
- Includes: Buses, trams, trolleybuses, and night buses
- Coverage: Full coverage of Bucharest and surrounding areas
- Cost:
 - Single trip: 1 €
 - 24-hour pass: 2 €
 - Monthly pass: 16 €
 - 🎓 Student discount: 90% off → 2 €/month at the University

 You can combine STB + Metro passes into one integrated card (~ 28 €/month).

Bicycle & Electric Scooter Sharing – Eco-Friendly & Flexible

- ✓ Best For: Short trips, campus hopping, or nice-weather days
- Services: Lime, Flow, TIER, Bolt (for scooters), l'Velo (bikes)
- Cost:
 - Usually 1 €/minute
 - Monthly passes also available
- 🔒 Some services require a Romanian card, so check app requirements before use.

Train (CFR) – For Trips Outside Bucharest

- ✓ Best For: Traveling to other cities (e.g., Cluj, Braşov, Constanţa)
- Discounts: Students in Romania often get 50%–100% off train fares for domestic travel.

Tips for International Students:

- Apply for a student card (legitimă de student) from your university to get travel discounts.
- Use Google Maps or the InfoTransport Bucharest app for real-time routes and transit info.
- Many buses and trams require contactless card payment or prepaid STB cards – no cash.

- Locations: Present in most Romanian cities, including Bucharest.



Lidl

- Overview: Another German discount supermarket offering quality products at affordable prices.
- Highlights: Known for private-label products and weekly special offers.
- Locations: Widely available across Romania.



Carrefour

- Overview: A French multinational with a presence in Romania, offering a wide range of products.
- Highlights: Features both local and international products, including a variety of halal and vegetarian options.
- Locations: Available in major cities and towns.

- Asian & Indian Grocery Stores: In cities like Bucharest, Cluj-Napoca, and Timișoara, you'll find stores catering to international tastes, offering spices, rice, lentils, and other specialty items.
- Tip: Buying in bulk from these stores can save money over time.

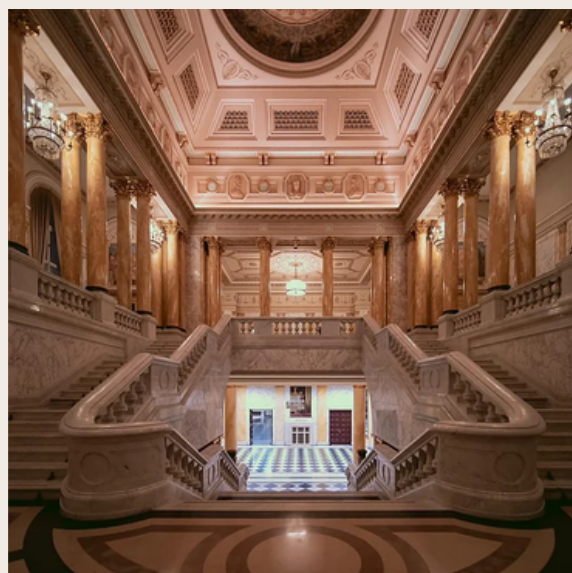

It showcases **bold, innovative films** that push the limits of conventional filmmaking, featuring both short and feature-length films in various competitions and special programs.



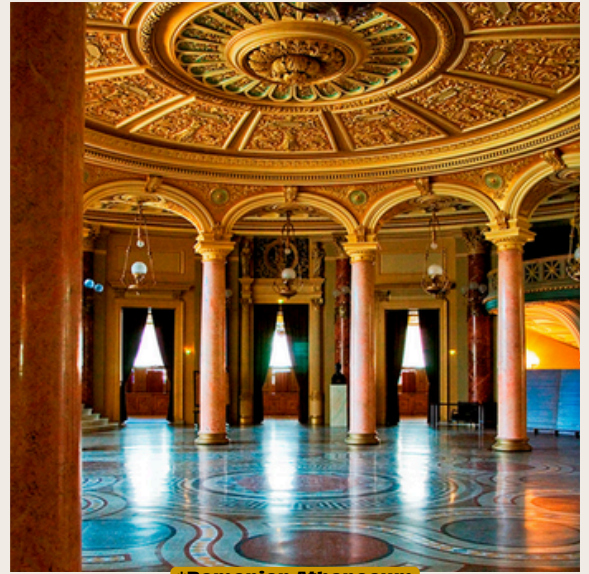

This gorgeous concert hall hosts some amazing performances, **and students often get discounted tickets**. It's also worth a visit just to admire the building itself.

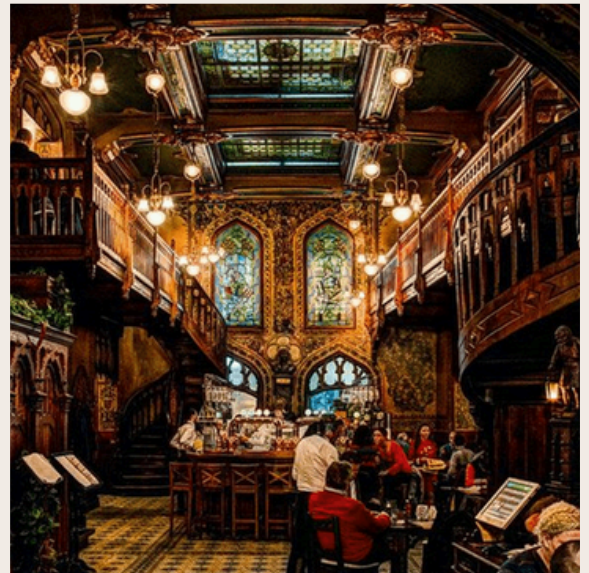
