1st April

- **Strengthening Global Ties: ASE and Egypt Forge New Academic Pathways**

We are pleased to announce a productive meeting between Prof. Dr. Constantin Marius Profiroiu, Vice Rector for International Relations, and Ms. Noha Pasha, representative of the Embassy of the Arab Republic of Egypt in Bucharest. The discussion focused on building strategic bridges between the Bucharest University of Economic Studies (ASE) and several prestigious Egyptian institutions, including:

2nd April

- **Building the future of international education!**

On April 4, a meeting took place between Prof. Dr. Constantin-Marius Profiroiu, Vice-Rector for International Relations, Prof. Dr. Celal Taşdoğan, Educational Advisor, and Ms. Ayşenur Topaloğlu, Local Secretary of the Embassy of the Republic of Turkey in Romania. On this occasion, the foundations of joint academic programs were discussed, as well as opportunities for collaboration between the Bucharest Academy of Economic Studies (ASE) and Turkish universities accredited by the “triple crown”. It was also proposed to promote ASE in the future guide for students from Turkey.

7th April

- **Finalization of the selection process for Erasmus+ long-term study mobilities**

Within the selection process for Erasmus+ long-term study mobilities (one semester or one full year) for the academic year 2026-2027, 1017 students submitted their application files during the registration stage, 918 of whom were declared Admitted following the eligibility check and passing the interview test. Of these, 661 students were assigned to one of the seven options expressed, and the remaining 257 were on the waiting list for redistribution. At the end of the redistribution stage, 108 students were assigned, 56 ended up on the waiting list, and the remaining 139 did not complete their options (they did not compete in the redistribution stage).



16-23rd April

- **Academic mobility at ASE: Prof. Carlos Ramirez Valdebenito from Chile**

Prof. Dr. Carlos Fortunato Ramirez Valdebenito, from the University of Santiago de Chile (Universidad Central de Chile), Santiago, Republic of Chile, participated in the bimonthly Mobility Café event, where he presented his academic experience at ASE, in comparison with the Chilean academic environment.

During the period 16–23 April this year, he carried out teaching activities at the bachelor's and master's level within the Faculty of Economics and Business Communication, as well as within the Doctoral School of Economics I.

Prof. Ramirez Valdebenito also had working meetings with Prof. Dr. Silvia Iacob, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Mirela Aceleanu, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Andreea Șerban, Prof. Dr. Grigore Piroșca and Assoc. Prof. Dr. Roberta Ștănef.

Prof. Dr. Dr. Constantin-Marius Profiroi, Vice-Rector for International Relations, also had a meeting with Prof. Dr. Carlos Fortunato Ramirez Valdebenito, during which aspects regarding the consolidation of academic cooperation and the development of international exchanges between institutions were discussed. This academic mobility contributed to the consolidation of the exchange of good practices and the development of international collaboration between ASE and the Central University of Chile.

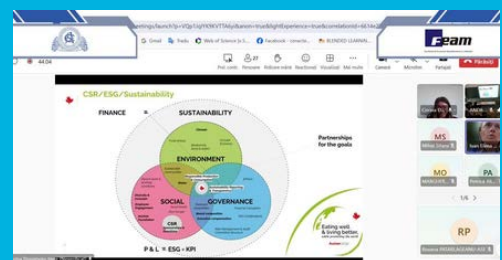
- **The first COIL project of FEAM**

Internationalization activities carried out by the faculties within ASE

Center for Japanese Studies



The month of April at ASE began with the Student Scientific Communications Session. Starting from magical formulas in anime and moving toward authentic Romanian traditions, the lecture opened up surprising perspectives on the dialogue between Japanese pop culture and our own cultural heritage.

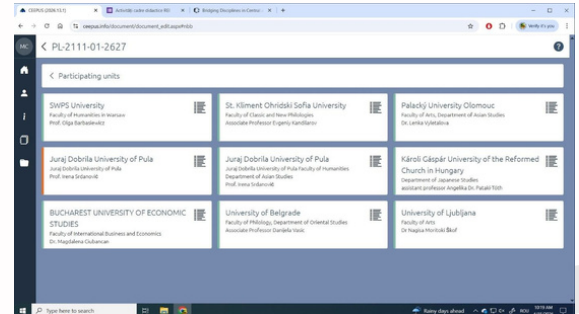

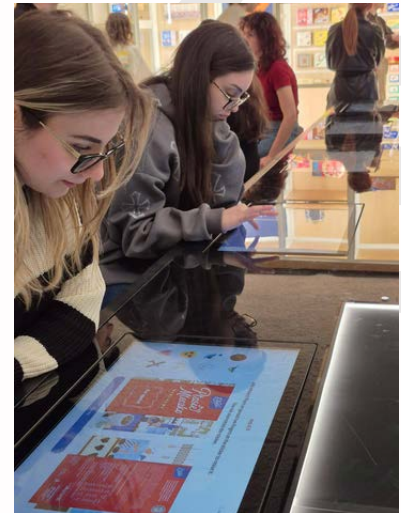

BIP Erasmus+ Japanese Studies Between April 20 and 24, the Center for Japanese Studies at ASE represented Romania for the first time in an Erasmus+ BIP program dedicated to Japanese Studies, hosted by SWPS University in Warsaw. The program, titled “Shaping Business Relations between Japan and CEE,” brought together over 50 participants from nine Central and Eastern European countries. Students from the Faculty of International Business and Economics (REI and LMA), the Faculty of Management, and the Faculty of Accounting and Management Information Systems, together with professors from the Center, took part in courses and activities exploring Japan–Central and Eastern Europe business relations from multiple perspectives. These included translation and interpretation issues, legal and judicial systems, types of Japanese products on the CEE market, tourism, differences in social media promotion between the two regions, etc. The program also included case studies and visits to Japanese companies in Poland, giving students the opportunity to meet representatives of Ajinomoto and Lotte-Wedel and to discuss directly the challenges Japanese companies face when entering European markets. We will continue this series of projects aimed at training future business persons and specialists in economics and social sciences who also have a strong background in Japanese Studies.

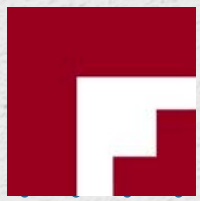

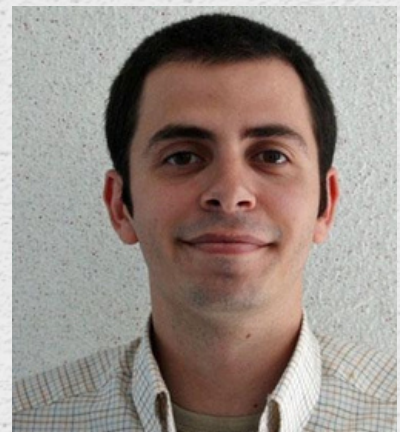


April 28, 2026: Alexandru Minea, invited at the “Money, Finance, Banking” Scientific Seminar

During the weekly Scientific Seminar “Money, Finance, Banking” organized by the Faculty of Finance and Banking, Alexandru Minea delivered a presentation on “The Perils of Fiscal Feedback Rules”. The paper introduces a fiscal feedback rule (FFR) in an endogenous growth model with public debt dynamics.

It is assumed that part of the debt burden is covered by tax increases (“sterilization”), while the remaining part is financed by issuing new debt. The paper shows that while low sterilization does not ensure the existence of a long-run steady state, high sterilization can lead to multiple steady states and aggregate instability in the form of local and global indeterminacy, potentially condemning the economy to a low-growth/high-debt trap steady state and long-lasting public debt cycles. By combining econometric estimations and a calibration exercise on developed economies, the article highlights that these various perils can occur for empirically plausible values of the sterilization coefficient.



Professor Kurt Hafner, Ph.D.
Hochschule Heilbronn

Kurt A. Hafner is Professor of Economics and Quantitative Methods at the Faculty of International Business at Heilbronn University of Applied Sciences. His teaching covers micro- and macroeconomics, international economics, quantitative methods, and financial risk management.

His research focuses on new economic geography, international trade, technology transfer, economic integration, and econometric analysis of non-stationary time series and cointegration. He has published on topics such as industrial diversification and growth stability in Europe, monetary unions in Latin America, and the role of foreign direct investment in regional development in transition economies.



Lecturer Madeleine Meurer, Ph.D.
Erasmus University

It covers elements in the research process including problem and research question definition, literature review, hypothesis formulation and development, research design, data collection and cleaning methods, sampling strategies, reporting research results and drafting of conclusions.

It provides a basis for consideration of research issues covered in a number of subjects within various specialization areas in the degree program. The course is structured such that to enable students to develop advanced research skills relevant to a large panel of business situations.

In addition, there is a strong emphasis on the use of statistical computer packages, with a focus on big data and high frequency data econometric modeling, and results' interpretation. Research techniques and methods will be examined for the formulation of hypotheses, development of testable objectives, experimental design, subject selection, data collection, data analysis and interpretation, and report preparation.

Specifically, upon the completion of this course, students should be able to explain the purpose and types of business research design, state research problems clearly and precisely, develop propositions, and state set of hypotheses to be tested. They should be able to demonstrate knowledge of research processes, performing literature reviews, define and develop research interests using specific research designs. They will get the necessary tools to make reasoned decisions as to the appropriate data collection method for specific studies, as well to identify and apply the relevant statistical tools or methods, by using computer technology in the solution of advanced business research problems.



Professor Chantal Moll De Alba
University of Barcelona

The course is meant to provide the Master students with the necessary understanding of the legal relations on which the trade activities are based, namely the contract. Also, the course is aimed to present disputes resolution and some special types of contracts, all from the international view, but still analysing the issues they encounter in everyday corporate life.

The course of Ethics and Academic Integrity was delivered entirely in French and addressed central topics such as student and professors' integrity, research conduct, and institutional governance. My contribution included delivering lectures, facilitating interactive discussions, presenting case studies, and guiding group work.



In particular, I encouraged students to analyze the moral principles and professional standards required in higher education and research. Students worked on practical examples and discussed contemporary academic ethics challenges such as plagiarism and using AI for research content creation and publication.

The course of Financial Reporting and Analysis was delivered entirely in French and addressed central topics such as the preparation, interpretation, and evaluation of financial statements (balance sheet, income statement, cash flow). The contribution included delivering lectures, facilitating interactive discussions, presenting case studies, and guiding group work.



In particular, M.Beldi encouraged students to analyze the revenue recognition, asset/liability measurement, ratio analysis, and cash flow, designed to aid decision-making in investment, credit analysis, and corporate finance.

Christian teaches Technology Entrepreneurship at the Master in Digital Business Innovation at FABIZ, with a strong emphasis on how market platforms reshape competition, value creation, and growth. In his courses, students explore how platforms such as marketplaces, app ecosystems, and multi-sided digital businesses create value by connecting different user groups, reducing transaction costs, and generating network effects. He focuses not only on how these models are built, but also on why some platforms scale, defend their position, and become dominant, while others fail to reach critical mass.





The first accredited COIL project at BUES has officially launched

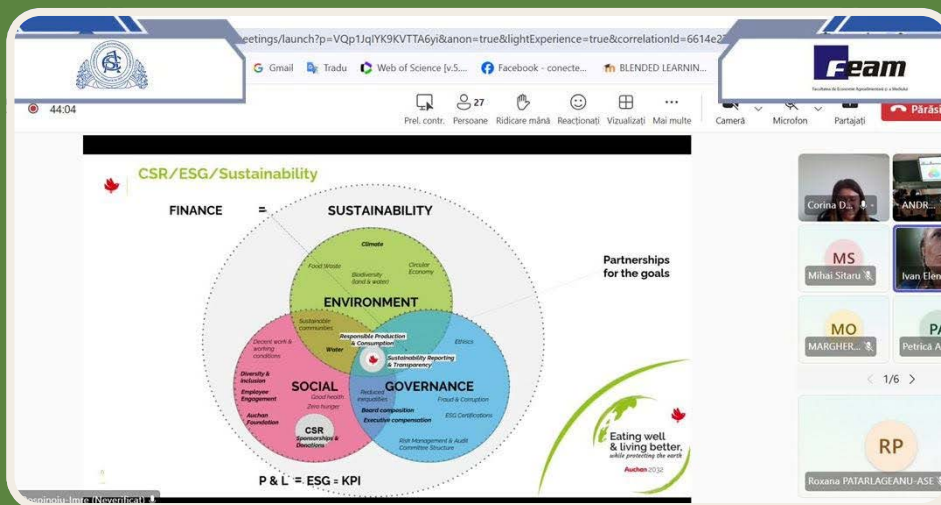
April 16, 2026

The inaugural lecture was delivered by Ms. Corina Dospinoiu, Sustainability Leader at Auchan Romania, who brought to students a real-world perspective from one of retail's major players on environmental responsibility and sustainable growth strategies.

Prof. Andreea Apetrei (UCV) and Assoc. Prof. Simona Roxana Pătărlăgeanu (EAM-BUES) brought together EAM student teams and UCV students — hailing from across Europe, Asia, and South America — to jointly explore the theme in a truly international classroom.



On April 24, FABIZ - ASE students will have the opportunity to participate in two special courses on European Union Law taught by our guest, Patrick Sensburg.

Prof. PhD Patrick Sensburg is a personality with extensive experience at the intersection of academia, law and politics. Professor of Public Law and European Law at the University of Applied Sciences for Police and Public Administration in North Rhine-Westphalia, he initially worked in Münster, continuing his work in Cologne since 2022.

His professional career also includes his work as a lawyer at Maslaton & Kollegen, as well as his involvement in the field of mediation, being executive director of the German Mediation Association (DGM) and member of the board since 2005.

In politics, he was a member of the German Parliament from 2009 to 2021, where he played an active role in European affairs, including as chairman of the European Law Committee and the NSA Investigation Committee. He is currently a member of the G-10 Commission of the German Parliament, responsible for authorizing surveillance measures carried out by intelligence services.

His long-standing collaboration with the ASE Faculty of Law reflects a constant contribution to the academic development and strengthening of the international dimension of our programs, being an appreciated presence in both teaching and research activities.



On April 28, we will have the pleasure of having Adrian Rycerski, Doctor of Law, Assistant Professor at SWPS University (Poland) and a lawyer specializing in financial markets and corporate law, join us.

With a solid academic and professional background, he is a certified advisor at the MTF (Warsaw Stock Exchange), holder of the FinTech Professional certification (The University of Hong Kong) and the Crypto-Asset Anti-Financial Crime Specialist (ACAMS) certification. His scientific activity is remarkable, being the author of numerous specialized publications and co-author of reference works, such as commentaries on the legislation on public offerings, bonds, trading in financial instruments and the prevention of money laundering.

His practice covers highly topical areas, such as issuer transparency obligations (MAR), financial instruments regime (MiFID II), crypto-assets (MiCAR), banking law, as well as the prevention and fight against money laundering and terrorist financing (AML/CFT), constantly combining the theoretical perspective with practical applicability.

During the meeting, students will have the opportunity to explore current topics in banking law and European Union law, in an approach that combines the theoretical perspective with practical experience in the financial field.

Through programs like Erasmus+, BUES facilitates study exchanges, internships, and teaching placements across numerous partner institutions worldwide. These initiatives aim to enhance academic experiences, promote cultural exchange, and strengthen global networks.
